Farm workers have the lowest annual family income of any U.S. wage & salary workers earning, on average, \$11,000

- Most farm workers are paid by piece-rate.
- In the past 20 years, after accounting for inflation, farm worker wages have declined more than 20%





Hazardous work conditions:



Heat Stress

- Working in the sun all day can be dangerous if not provided water and shade breaks.
- In North Carolina, 7 farm workers died of heat related illnesses in a 5 year period.
- In California, 15 farm workers died of heat related illnesses since 2004

Pesticide Exposure

- Getting sprayed while picking
 No enforcement of re-entry to fields after spraying
- Skin contact with pesticide residue
- Drift from spayers
- •No way to wash hands/clothes

Hazardous work conditions:



Pesticide exposures have caused Birth defects and reproductive problems

Child Labor

The government estimates that 500,000 farm workers are under the age of 18



- Because farm worker wages are low, children work alongside their parents and/or guardians
- At times, children are separated from their families
- Child labor policy in agriculture allows children to start working at 12

Farm Worker Women



- hold their own families together while making up 22% of the agricultural workforce
- 90% of farm worker women in California surveyed identified sexual harassment as a major problem.



Modern Day Slavery

Since 1997, in Florida, 9 cases of slavery involving farm workers – involving more than 1,000 workers - have been prosecuted.

How?

- Withholding wages, passport, visa, and/or identification documents
- Indentured servitude/debt bondage
- Use of violence
- Threats to family
- Threats of deportation
- Locked in at night and watched throughout the day

National Farm Worker Ministry

Together with Farm Workers Harvesting Justice

NFWM began in 1920's as a ministry of charity and service, providing food, clothing and day care to the farm workers.

When César Chávez & Delores Huerta began organizing in the 1960's, they called on the religious community to change its emphasis from charity to justice.






NFWM's MISSION

Tobacco farmworkers deserve better.




The situation for tobacco farmworkers in North Carolina is dire.

"We have traction in moving the agenda forward," said FLOC President Baldemar Velasquez, "but we can't let up until we have an agreement that guarantees the right to bargain collectively for all farm workers in Reynolds supply chain. **Workers need to be able to solve the problems they face at work.**"



We demand

A fair day's pay for a fair day's work. A safe workplace. Decent housing. A written agreement guaranteeing farmworkers' right to freedom of association and collective bargaining.



- Average piece rate of 50 cents for every 32 lbs. of tomatoes picked - must pick nearly 2 ½ tons of tomatoes to earn minimum wage in a typical 10-hour
- Wage theft, verbal & physical abuse, sexual harassment; and even forced labor (modern-day slavery)
