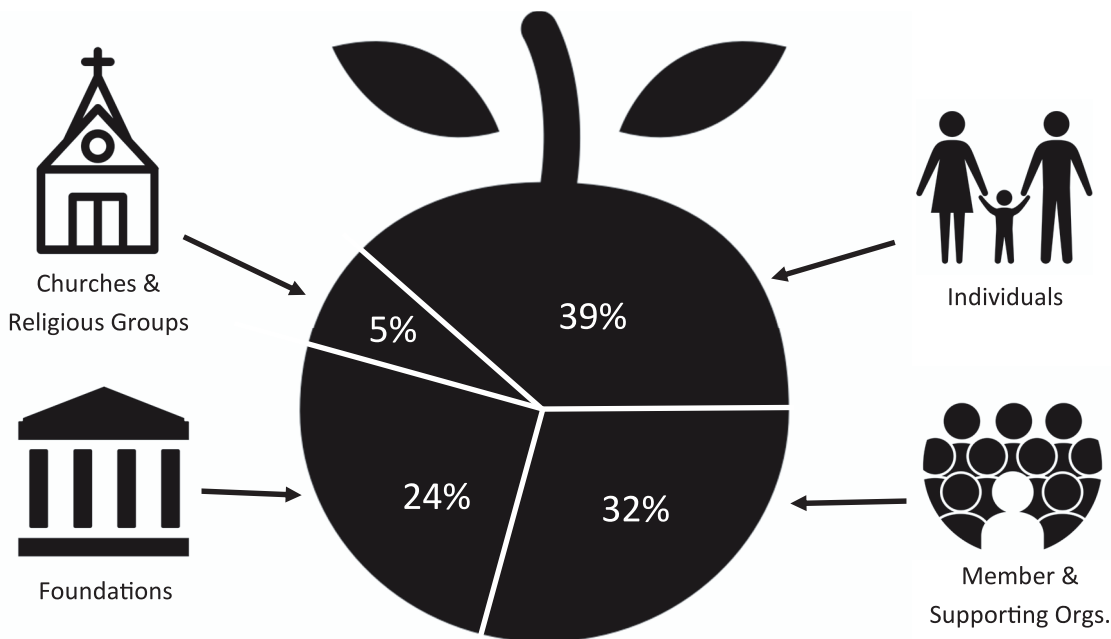

Since July when the NFWM Board endorsed the boycott of Sakuma Bros., Driscoll's & Häagen-Dazs strawberry ice cream, we've been mobilizing supporters to call on Sakuma Bros. to recognize FUJ as the representative of the workers and sign a binding contract with the farm workers. 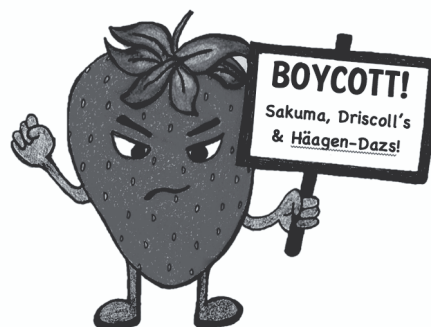
**We call on Mr. Weeden to sit down in good faith with Familias Unidas por la Justicia.**
